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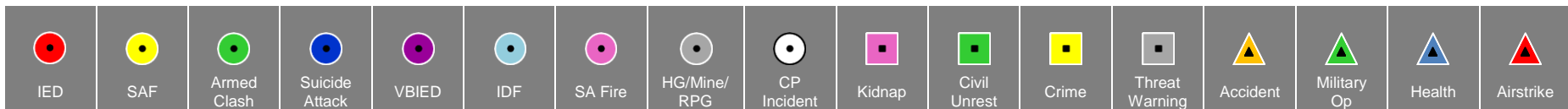
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LIBYA ACTIVITY MAP

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OUTLOOK

Short term outlook

- Rumors over Field Marshal Khalifa Haftar's health could cause some destabilization in the east and parts of the south. Should he resume his duties, there is likely to have been irreversible damage done to his reputation.
- The LNA continues to build pressure on Derna with additional reinforcements and indications of an increasing tempo of operations. Although the LNA has stated the MSCD has failed to disarm, negotiations are believed to be ongoing which could impact on the situation. The LNA is currently using the offensive to try and keep the focus away from rumors over Haftar's health.
- A ceasefire is now in place in Sabha which has resulted in a reduction of incidents however the city remains tense, and efforts are underway to find a more long-term solution. At present, it appears as though the LNA has made gains in the area, but these remain tenuous at present and could be reversed.

Medium to long term outlook

- As political talks fail to find any meaningful agreements, the concept of fresh elections has begun to gain traction amongst the political establishment. Deep divisions remain amongst the various factions, and an election blueprint has yet to be agreed. A number of those supporting the idea do not necessarily support the notion of a democratic establishment but are looking to exploit elections in a bid to gain power. The general population also remain skeptical of the political process and remain unclear what they would be voting for, highlighting the lack of structure and agreements currently around the process. The elections will trigger further posturing and maneuvering from various factions.
- IS continues to become bolder, mounting hit and run attacks against security forces and critical national infrastructure. They are also conducting criminal activity to raise funds and to help supply the group. The terrorist organization is believed to be trying to rebuild its capability in Libya and manpower is reported to be heading to the south of the country. IS will continue to benefit from the lack of political and security unity in Libya and may look to establish a fresh alliance with other extremist groups like al-Qaeda.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

Governance

- The head of the High National Electoral Commission (HNEC), Imad al-Sayed, has said that HNEC will suspend its work towards national elections due to a lack of funding and the poor outlook for progress. He also called on the HoR to pass an election law and stated that UNSMIL should not be driving the process, as it was the duty of the government. The move came after Tala al-Mayhoub, the head of the HoR National defense and Security Committee, called for the HNEC to be dissolved stating it was not within its remit to "enter into the details of election laws," indicating tensions continue between the HoR and HNEC over elections.
- Ali Salabi, a member of the International Union of Muslim Scholars, has urged Ghassan Salamé to cooperate with the Supreme Court over proposed elections, stating it is accepted by most Libyans and can issue electoral laws and a constitutional declaration. Salabi has previously backed proposed elections, calling the current political bodies "illegitimate."
- UN Envoy Ghassan Salamé has stated that there is "plenty of time to get an election law through the HoR in consultation with the HCS." He stated he would work on implementing the Security Council's resolution relating to the holding of elections before the end of 2018.
- Khalid al-Mishri was elected president of the High Council of State (HCS) during a vote in Tripoli this week. Mishri is a member of the Justice and Construction Party (Muslim Brotherhood) and replaces Abdulrahman Swahili who has held the position since the formation of the HCS two years ago. Following his election, Mishri called for an urgent meeting with the HoR to "end the country's political divisions." The President of the HoR, Aquila Saleh welcomed the request and stated he would meet Mishri in either Tripoli or Tobruk.
- The High Council of Fezzan Tribes and Cities called on all elected members of the HoR, HCS, and PC to "suspend their membership and return to Fezzan immediately until a resolution over fighting in Sabha is reached." The call came days before a ceasefire was announced.
- The Libyan National Gathering (LNG) has opened in two more locations this week, Gharyan and Brak Shati.

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- The mayor of Shahat, near Bayda, is asking for municipal elections as the council's term has expired. The council was the first to be elected in 2014. Many others will also see their terms expire this year however preparatory work to hold municipal elections has not yet taken place.
- The head of the National Anti-Corruption Commission has referred the GNA Minister of the Economy to the Attorney General. The decision is based on a number of incidents of ministerial orders being signed without having an appropriate committee being established to authorize them, as well as suspicions that contracts have been awarded inappropriately.

Security

- Unconfirmed reports suggest Field Marshall Khalifa Haftar has suffered a medical emergency, possibly a stroke. He was reported to be in a military hospital in France receiving treatment. The reports came just after the HoR had announced that President Aquila Saleh was now commander in chief of the military, a position held by GNA President Fayeze Sarraj under the LPA.
- The GNA announced a new contract with a pay increase for the military the day Haftar was reported to be ill in hospital.
- The bodies of the three Sharshari children kidnapped in December 2015 have been uncovered in a forest south of Surman. RDF has arrested the man in charge of the investigation. A demonstration was held in Surman while local governmental departments were shut for three days of mourning.
- RDF and Nawasi Brigade had a brief exchange of fire in Tripoli after RDF had tried to get a Nawasi affiliate to remove illegal tint from his windows.
- 80 Battalion has deployed to Dirj, east of Ghadames, to help secure the border. The deployment comes after Tunisian security forces engaged fuel smugglers along the border on April 05.
- The formation of a new brigade has been announced by municipal leaders in Gharyan. The brigade has been formed from existing militia security forces and comes under the command of the Gharyan Military Council. The move comes after the Municipal Council raised concerns of a security vacuum after Arif Khoja, the former Interior Minister, refused to appoint Colonel Ali Triki as the Director of the Security Directorate in mid-January, resulting in the closure of the security directorate in the city.
- Additional reinforcements have arrived for LNA troops on the outskirts of Derna. This follows a statement from Haftar last week that the liberation of the city was “imminent.” The tempo of operations is also showing indications of increasing.
- An unconfirmed report suggests that the Obeidat Tribe and the Katibat Awliya’ al-Dam (Avengers of the Blood) are trying to establish a reconciliation committee which aims to lift the siege of Derna. The Obeidat are the Saadi tribe which dominates the area. The Katibat Awliya’ al-Dam is formed from friends and relatives of those killed by RSCB and allies in Benghazi.
- Abu Salem Central Security (Ghneiwa) has opened a newly built joint security room in the south of the district by the airport road in Tripoli.
- Operation Storm of the Homeland has moved to a defensive posture after declaring the area “totally free of terrorists.”
- A HoR representative announced a ceasefire in Sabha and stated that 6 Brigade is now controlled by Brigadier Khalifa Hafiz, who was appointed by Haftar in February. If accurate, it would indicate a growing LNA influence in the city after attempts to resolve the issue by the GNA have apparently been unsuccessful. The HoR has also subsequently declared a state of emergency in the south. A committee is to be formed to “solve the crisis in Sabha” as work continues to resolve the issues long term.
- Writer and political analyst, Ezzedine Aqil, has claimed that Britain has Special Forces inside Libya in “civilian uniform.” Aqil bases this claim on the fact that the ambassador “travels to places far from the HQ of his embassy, despite the renewal of Britain’s warning to its citizens against travel to Libya because of the security situation.” Therefore, he claims, Britain may have “special forces inside Libya in civilian uniform, in charge of protection and security, in addition to the presence of additional forces, in other places, which monitors these visits and can intervene in larger numbers, in difficult moments.” Aqil finished by claiming this was a serious breach of Libyan sovereignty.

Oil & Gas

- Libya has managed to maintain oil output at over one million barrels per day despite El Feel remaining shut.



Travel

- Zawiyah refinery resumes supplies to Tripoli as the capital continues to experience fuel queues.
- Fuel supplies arrived at the Sabha fuel depot following the ceasefire and were subsequently distributed to stations in the city. 12 Brigade, 116 Infantry Regiment and 181 Infantry Regiment (LNA) along with the military police were tasked with protecting the tankers by Major General Mohammed Bin Nail (LNA).

Threat Warning

- The competition committee of the Libyan Premier League has announced that it has made a number of changes to the fixtures of matches due to be played across the country on April 14 at 1630hrs. A number of clubs, including Ahli Tripoli, have declared that they will not play if venues are changed in protest at the move. The two stadia affected in the capital are Tripoli International Stadium and Janzour Stadium.

Governance

HCS: New president elected with smooth handover of power

On April 08, Khalid al-Mishri from the Justice and Construction Party (J&C Party) was elected as president of the HCS after voting went to a second round at the Radisson Blu Hotel. Mishri replaces Abdulrahman Swahili from Misrata, who had served two terms and had stood for a third. Mishri won 65 votes in the second round, over Swahili's 45. Swahili had won the first round, which included four people, by one vote. Other candidates had included Mohammad Amazzeb from the National Front Party (widely seen as a Muslim Brotherhood affiliate) and Abdullah Ajwan, an independent candidate. Naji Mukhtar was also elected as the first deputy president, replacing Saleh Al-Makhzoum. Fawzi Aqab replaced Amazzeb as the second deputy. Reports indicate that the National Front Party backed Mishri in the second vote while a deal was done with supporters of Ajwan for the vice presidency position.



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Security

LNA: Haftar reported to have suffered a medical emergency

On April 11, reporting broke that Field Marshal Khalifa Haftar, commander of the LNA, had suffered a stroke and was being cared for in Paris, France after being flown there from Jordan. Reporting was inconsistent with some stating he had suffered a heart attack, was in a coma, or was not in a critical condition and his condition was improving. He was also reported to have met with the Crown Prince and Saudi Defense Minister, Mohammed bin Salman, in Paris at the George V Hotel on April 11.

In response to the rumors, LNA spokesman Brigadier General Ahmed Mismari initially claimed that Haftar was in “excellent health.” He later stated he was in Jordan for talks before admitting he was in Paris, but claimed he was not ill. Both he and Khalifa al-Obeidi, the Information Office Director for the LNA, have tried instead to keep the focus on LNA operations against the MSCD in Derna. As the days drew on, the French media suggested that the LNA had acknowledged that Haftar had undergone emergency surgery. HoR President Aquila Saleh stated he had been in contact with Haftar to discuss military issues and everything was proceeding as normal.

Operation Storm of the Homeland: Area now “free from terrorists”

On April 09, Mohamed el-Sallak, spokesman for GNA President Fayeze Saraj, claimed that after eight days, the area of operations covered by “Storm of the Homeland” was now “completely free of any elements of terrorist organizations and that operation’s patrols are stationed in the region and are fully securing it.” He also stated that the “Anti-Terror Force has not, and will not, enter any city or region” and claimed that its remit was “limited to dealing with any potential targets in the valleys and suburbs.” Sallak further stated that there has been no participation from foreign forces in the operation and that the focus was shifting to defending the area.

Surman: Bodies of the Sharshari children found dead

On April 07, security forces found the bodies of the three young Sharshari children who had been kidnapped on December 02, 2015 while on their way to school. A ransom had been demanded for the children. Reports now indicate the children were killed around a month after their kidnap, however, negotiations had continued. The gang believed to be responsible, al-Nimri, was targeted in an operation on March 15 in Surman. Their leader was wounded and apparently recently confessed to the whereabouts of the children.

On the same day, RDF arrested Mohamed Alkieb at Matiga Airport as he was trying to leave. Alkieb was the head of the Criminal Investigations Department (CID) in Sabratabh and head of a joint CID/ RDF investigation into the Sharshari kidnapping. He was arrested for apparently taking false confessions and taking the investigation in the wrong direction. With the find of the bodies, his conclusions had unraveled, and he was preparing to flee when arrested. Some reports have named him as the “mastermind” of the kidnapping, however, the situation remains unclear at this time.

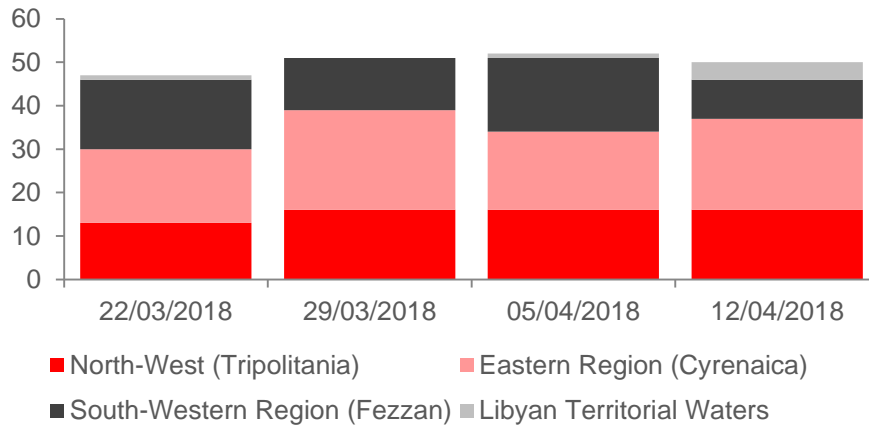

Tripolitania

Significant activity

- Kidnap - Apr 06 07:00, Al-Jafara Province, Aziziyah: Jamal Saleh al-Latif, the mayor of Aziziyah, was kidnapped from his home in Saadia. He had reportedly received threatening text messages prior to his abduction and blood was found in his home after the incident. Latif was found outside a mosque in front of the Bir District of Aziziyah on the evening of April 11 by worshippers who responded after hearing gunshots. Latif had sustained two gunshots to his legs.
- Troop Movements - Apr 07, Nalut Province, Dirj: 80 Infantry Battalion has been deployed to Dirj and the border areas.
- Arrest - Apr 07, Tripoli Province, Matiga Airport: RDF arrested Mohamed Alkieb at Matiga Airport as he was trying to leave.
- Armed Clash - Apr 07, Tripoli Province, Tripoli: A clash occurred between RDF and Nawasi Brigade after RDF tried to get illegal tints removed from a vehicle. The driver was affiliated to Nawasi Brigade and returned with armed men, opening fire at the RDF position.
- Demonstration - Apr 08, Az Zawiyah Province, Surman: A demonstration took place following the find of the bodies of the three Sharshari children kidnaped in December 2015.
- Accident - Apr 08, Nuqat Al-Khams Province, Aljmail: A six-month-old twin baby died in a house fire. The baby's mother was also injured.
- Mine Found/Cleared - Apr 08, Sirte Province, Sirte: A mine was found and cleared at a car park at the Polyclinic Complex.
- Kidnap - Apr 09, Tripoli Province, Ain Zara: Ramadan Taweeb, a Libyan Center for Media and Freedom of Expression member, was kidnapped after attending a meeting with security heads. Taweeb is a Palestinian journalist and is the sixth journalist accredited by the Department of Foreign Media to disappear within recent months.
- Arrest - Apr 09, Tripoli Province, Matiga Airport: A man was arrested trying to take 914,000 Euros to Turkey.
- Murder/ Execution - Apr 10, Tripoli Province, Tajura: Two members of 103 Infantry Battalion (LNA) were found shot dead in Tajura.
- Arrest - Apr 10, Tripoli Province, Matiga Airport: Ashraf Mahmoud al-Fazani, an IS leader, was arrested at Matiga Airport. Fazani is associated with the fight for Benghazi against the LNA.
- Arrest - Apr 11, Misrata Province, Misrata: Security forces arrested two men and a woman for robbery. They seized 700,000 LYD and half a kilogram of gold jewellery. During the arrest, shots were fired a security forces, one of whom was injured when a car rammed him.

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Cyrenaica

Significant activity

- IED Find - Apr 06, Derna Province, Derna: An IED was discovered and defused by the LNA west of the city.
- Security Announcement - Apr 06, Al-Jabal Al-Akhdar Province, Shahat: Security forces have begun carrying out patrols south of Shahat. The patrols are looking to disrupt criminal gangs operating in the area including smuggling and human trafficking.
- Armed Attack - Apr 07, Benghazi Province, Benghazi: A fuel truck was attacked near the Rubash Market.
- Arrest - Apr 07, Al-Wahat Province, Awjila: Security forces detained 50 illegal immigrants. Five were suffering from hepatitis.
- Armed Clash - Apr 08, Derna Province, Derna: MSCD launched another attack against LNA forces to the south of Derna.
- Shooting - Apr 08, Benghazi Province, Benghazi: Salah Bulaghib was shot and injured during an incident in Benghazi while three of his companions were also wounded. The fight reportedly erupted after Bulaghib attempted to take a piece of land owned by the al-Haddads and engaged with policemen from the Fuwaihat district. Initial sources claimed the attack was an assassination attempt however as yet there is no other information to support this. Bulaghib was taken to hospital and underwent surgery for a gunshot wound in the stomach.
- IDF - Apr 09, Derna Province, Derna: 322 Artillery Brigade (LNA) mounted an IDF attack using a BM21 Grad 122mm multiple rocket launcher against MSCD positions in the red axis.
- Troop Movements - Apr 09, Derna Province, Derna: The LNA has deployed 106, 155, 166 Infantry Battalions and the Tariq Bin Ziyad Brigade to Derna following another MSCD assault against LNA positions on April 08.
- IDF - Apr 10, Derna Province, Derna: The LNA has mounted an intense IDF attack against MSCD positions in Derna. Casualties were reported.
- IED - Apr 11, Benghazi Province, Suq Al-Hout: Two civilians were wounded when an IED detonated in a building along Umar Ibn al Aas Street. Given the location, the device may be a remnant of fighting which took place in the area in 2017.
- IDF - Apr 11, Derna Province, Ayn Marrah: The MSCD launched an IDF attack against LNA forces. The shells impacted in a nearby wadi without causing damage.
- Demonstration - Apr 11, Derna Province, Derna: School teachers and students demonstrated over the murder of the three Sharshari children.
- Armed Clash - Apr 11, Derna Province, Daher Al-Hamer: The LNA and MSCD continued fighting. IDF was also used.
- Troop Movements - Apr 11, Derna Province, Derna: LNA troops from Ajdabiya have been redeployed to Derna.

Fezzan

Significant activity

- IDF - Apr 07 19:00, Sabha Province, Tayouri: IDF impacted into Tayouri.
- IDF - Apr 08, Sabha Province, Nasriya: IDF impacted into Nasriyah neighborhood during the evening.
- Demonstration - Apr 09, Wadi Al-Hayaa Province, Alhatiy: Residents protested about deteriorating living conditions and the ongoing conflict in Sabha which has contributed to the issue.
- Demonstration - Apr 09, Sabha Province, Sabha: Residents demonstrated against deteriorating living conditions.
- Shooting - Apr 11, Sabha Province, Sabha: A car with tinted windows shot randomly at passing cars in different areas of the city, killing one person and wounding a further three.
